If you take an exam and pass, you can take the next higher class exam for no additional cost. If you do not pass and wish to try again an additional fee will be required.

Rare DX for N. Korea (DPRK) Set

"Official" P5/3Z9DX North Korea Activation Now Set for this Summer

Following an unexpected "demonstration" operation from North Korea – officially the Democratic People's Republic of Korea (DPRK) – just before Christmas, Polish DXer Dom Grzyb, 3Z9DX, now expects to be back in the DPRK – the most-wanted DXCC entity – for his "official" activation by late this summer, according to The Daily DX. He initially had anticipated returning this month or next.

P5/3Z9DX showed up on the air from the most-wanted DXCC entity on December 20 and 21 to demonstrate Radio for North Korean Amateur Over the course of that officials. activation - the first in more than a decade - P5/3Z9DX made nearly 785 SSB contacts, most of them on 15 meters. Nearly 600 of the contacts were with stations in Asia: P5/3Z9DX worked just 26 stations in North America. He has posted his log on ClubLog.

Grzyb recently contacted The Daily DX Editor Bernie McClenny, W3UR, to update his situation. During his visit, authorities were friendly and polite, McClenny reported, noting that he was also surprised that they allowed him to operate in December. P5/3Z9DX was severely hampered by extremely high noise levels on all HF bands, not to mention a geomagnetic storm. Noise, he said in a video posted on his website, made it "almost impossible" to copy weaker signals in Pyongyang.

When he goes back to the DPRK this summer, he will be operating from a far quieter location in a rural area, Grzyb told The Daily DX. While operating from North Korea in December, P5/3Z9DX was running 100 W to a vertical antenna mounted on a metal fence post some 7 feet above the ground government high-rise buildings. behind equipment was left in Pyongyang, as was agreed to before his December visit. The P5/3Z9DX preview was the first activation from North Korea since the 2001-2002 operation by Ed Giorgadze, 4L4FN. - Thanks to OPDX, The Daily DX

TECHNICIAN, GENERAL AND EXTRA CLASS QUESTION POOL REVIEW

From the Technician Class question pool:

T3A09 Which of the following results from the fact that skip signals refracted from the ionosphere are elliptically polarized?

- A. Digital modes are unusable
- B. Either vertically or horizontally polarized antennas may be used for transmission or reception

- C. FM voice is unusable
- D. Both the transmitting and receiving antennas must be of the same polarization

The correct answer is B. Since the recived signal is ellipitical (a combination of both horizontal and vertical polarization). Thus almost any antenna may be used to transmit or receive signals.

From the General Class question pool:

G9D11 Which of the following is a disadvantage of multiband antennas?

- A. They present low impedance on all design frequencies
- B. They must be used with an antenna tuner
- C. They must be fed with open wire line
- D. They have poor harmonic rejection

The correct answer is D. Since the antenna is designed to receive and transmit on multiple bands it will happily transmit any harmonic that falls within a band it is designed for. Hence, it is the operator's responsibility to insure his radio does not transmit harmonics out of band.

From the Extra Class question pool:

E9B02 In the antenna radiation pattern shown in Figure E9-1, what is

the front-to-back ratio?



- A 36 dB
- B. 18 dB
- C. 24 dB
- D. 14 dB

The correct answer is B. You can determine the front-to-back ratio by reading the value at 180° from the main lobe. Looking at figure E9-1 the main lobe maximum is at 0°. At 180° the lobe crosses the 180° lines halfway between 24 dB and 12 dB circles. Hence the ratio is 18 dB.
