your tickets with your name written on them, as well as the seller from whom you purchased said ticket.



VE TEST SESSION

The next VE session will be 7 January at 715 King Ave., Yuba City at 9:00 A.M. VE's are needed to administer the exam. The elements for Technician, General and Extra class will be offered. If you are planning on taking an exam you will need two forms of ID, at least one of them must be a picture ID. A fee of \$15.00 is required. A calculator may also be used as long as it has had all of its memories cleared and there are no built in or preprogrammed formulas.

If you are upgrading to a higher class you need to bring your license and a photocopy of the license.

If you take an exam and pass, you can take the next higher class exam for no additional cost. If you do not pass and wish to try again an additional fee will be required.

TECHNICIAN, GENERAL AND EXTRA CLASS QUESTION POOL REVIEW

From the Technician Class question pool:

T5D05 What is the resistance in a circuit for which the applied voltage is 12 volts and the current flow is 1.5 amperes?

- A. 18 ohms
- B. 0.125 ohms
- C. 8 ohms

D. 13.5 ohms

The correct answer is C. Ohm's law states that Voltage (V) or Electromotive Force (E) (measured in volts) equals Current (I) (measured in amperes or amps) times Resistance (R) (measured in ohms) -E = IR or V = IR. Note: Using voltage is the more archaic form of the formula. Modern usage use electromotive force.

You can think of the electromotive force as the electrical pressure causing current (electrons) to flow thru a given resistance. Increase the resistance and keep the voltage the same and less current flows.

Back to the question:

$$E = IR$$

Solving for resistance:

$$R = \frac{E}{I}$$

$$R = \frac{12}{1.5}$$

$$R = 8 \text{ ohms.}$$

From the General Class question pool:

G4D05 How does a signal that reads 20 dB over S9 compare to one that reads S9 on a receiver, assuming a properly calibrated S meter?

- A. It is 10 times less powerful
- B. It is 20 times less powerful
- C. It is 20 times more powerful
- D. It is 100 times more powerful

The correct answer is D. The dB is a logarithmic used to express the ratio of two physical quantities; in our case the power of received signals. The formula is

$$dB = 10log \frac{PowerA}{PowerB}$$

A 20 dB signals corresponds to a PowerA being 100 times more than PowerB.

From the Extra Class question pool:

E6A01 In what application is gallium arsenide used as a semiconductor material in preference to germanium or silicon?

- A In high-current rectifier circuits
- B. In high-power audio circuits
- C. In microwave circuits
- D. In very low frequency RF circuits

The correct answer is C. Gallium-arsenide (GaAs) has electron mobility and drift velocity (both are measures of how easily electrons are able to move through the crystal lattice) far higher than the standard doped germanium or silicon. GaAs devices are relatively insensitive to overheating owing to their wider energy bandgap and they also tend to create less noise in electronic circuits than silicon devices, especially at high frequencies. These superior properties are compelling reasons to use GaAs circuitry in mobile phones,

satellite communications, microwave point-to-point links and higher frequency radar systems. It is also used in the manufacture of Gunn diodes for the generation of microwaves.
