DXCC NOTE - By action of the ARRL Executive Committee, the January 1 cutoff date for receipt of confirmations of cross-mode contacts for single-mode DXCC awards has been suspended pending Board review at the annual meeting in March. All such contacts must be dated prior to October 1, 1981. For those of you who have the QSL card from Burma, the ARRL will not give credit toward the DXCC ladder for the contact. It seems that the Burma station has not been given the needed permission of the Burma government to operate.

PACIFIC DIRECTORATE MEETING - The Assistant Pacific Director Jan N6DDO, Jerry N6DDP, and Howard N6CCS recently attend the meeting at Dublin.
