Carol Phaffenberger's Oatmeal Cake

You Field Day attendees may be interested in this recipe.

1 cup minute oats - cover with 1 1/4 cup boiling water and set aside
Cream until fluffy:

1 Cup white sugar

1 cup brown sugar

1 cup butter

Beat in 2 eggs, 1 teaspoon cinnamon, 1 teaspoon nutmeg, 1/4 teaspoon salt, 1 teaspoon soda, 1 teaspoon baking powder, 1 teaspoon vanilla. Beat. Add oats and 1 1/3 cup flour. Bake in a greased 9 x 13 pan at 350 deg. for 35 minutes.

Frosting:

2/3 cup brown sugar

3 tablespoon cream

1/2 cup chopped nuts

3 tablespoon butter

1 egg

1 cup coconut

Bring to boil over medium heat stirring constantly. When cake is done, turn off oven and spread frosting on the cake. Return to oven for 16 minutes.
